2018 Spring Grant Application Instructions and Guidelines

The goal of grants awarded by the New Richmond Area Community Area Community Foundation is to improve the fabric of the New Richmond community. The New Richmond area is generally defined as the area encompassing the School District of New Richmond. We recognize that there are services/programs that are provided by organizations located outside of this area that benefit the community. The benefit of services/programs to the New Richmond community must be reflected in the grant application.

Application deadline: Grant applications must be received via email by Friday, April 20, 2018.

Eligible Applicants:

- Nonprofit organizations with 501(c)(3) status or groups that have an appropriate fiscal sponsor, and government entities (i.e., schools and municipalities).
- Churches and religious organizations may apply for support for activities that benefit the larger community, but not for activities that have a specific religious purpose.

Grants cannot be made to individuals.

Grant amount requests may range from \$100 to a maximum of \$1,500.

Applicants can only apply for one project/program per grant round.

Applicants must complete a NRACF funded project before applying for renewed funding for the same project. Other projects by an organization with an open-funded project will be considered.

Grant term: Project activities during the spring round start no earlier than July 1; project activities during the fall round start no earlier than January 1.

The Foundation does not accept applications for funding for the following:

- Routine operating expenses and annual campaigns
- Endowments
- Re-granting by another organization
- Political organizations
- Direct support of individuals
- Repeat grants to the same project on an open-ended basis.

Applications will be considered for program/project activities under one or more of the following categories:

- NRACF Destiny Drivers:
 - Leadership
 - Hunger
 - Literacy
 - Pathways
 - Shelter
 - Economic
- Youth and Families
- Autism Research/Family Support
- Other – must make a case for a project falling outside of priority categories

The grant application form is available on our web site. It cannot be saved and submitted from the web site. You must save the application form to your computer and then complete and save your application on your computer.

Submit the application as an attachment in an email to nracfoundation@gmail.com. Your application may be submitted as one or more documents (PDF or Word/Excel documents). You will receive a confirmation of your application within a few days of submission.
